

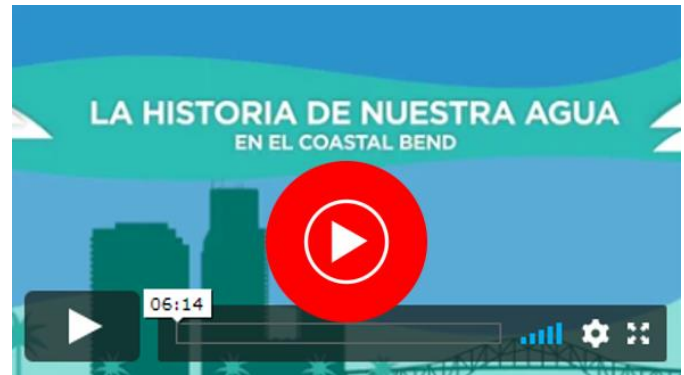
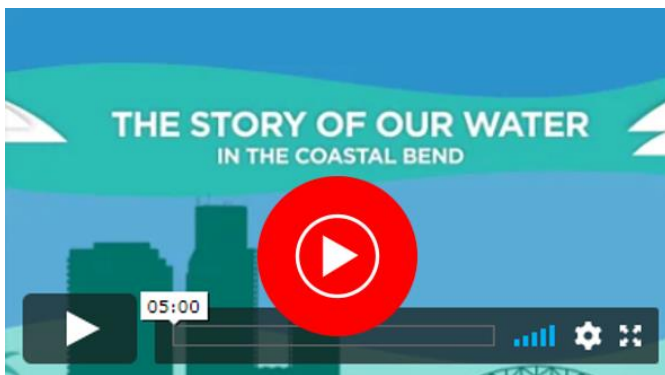

That is the story the Coastal Bend Bays & Estuaries Program (CBBEP) is telling with their new video *The Story of Our Water in the Coastal Bend*. The video aims to help Coastal Bend residents and visitors understand the water supply and how it is divided up among all the different users, including the bays and estuaries!
